3 wind power dev't approved by DOE

THE Department of Energy (DOE) has awarded three pre-commercial wind power development contracts to Alternergy Philippine Holdings Corp., a local firm identified with former energy secretary Vince Perez.

The contracts, signed on Dec. 24, 2008, gave Alternergy the right to assess the wind power potential in Caliraya in Laguna, Pililia in Rizal and

Abra de Ilog in Occidental Mindoro. According to the DOE's 2008 accomplishment report, the three pre-commercial wind resource assessment contracts were the first in a string of wind power deals that it would award in the coming months.

This year, the DOE plans to award six pre-commercial contracts for wind resource development to three local

The last remaining nickel mine firm in RP after 2008

Norway firm stays put but slows down plan

CALAPAN CITY – Norway-based Intex Resources ASA announced that despite the current global economic crisis and the drop of price in the world market of nickel mineral, they remain committed to the Philippines and will continue their nickel project in the central Mindoro Island this year 2009.

However, in a recent posting in their website, Intex Resources Philippines, Inc. and its local partner Aglubang Mining Corporation (AMC) stated it had deferred the completion of a definitive feasibility study for the said nickel mining project in Mindoro, including the construction of a \$2.9-billion processing plant, from early next year to the fourth

quarter of 2009, citing as reason the same global financial crisis.

"The new schedule is a board decision that will optimize the process and cost efficiency of the feasibility study, in reference to the current global financial situation," Intex president and chief executive officer Erlend Grimstad said in

statement.

Grimstad nevertheless stated that despite the current global economic crisis, Intex Resources "remains well-funded to take the Mindoro nickel project through a full study. The company has a strong cash position and no interest-bearing debt."

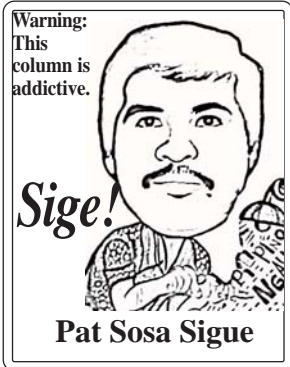

Sa 'exploration site' sa gitnang Mindoro

Parehas na pasahod sa mga Mangyan

CALAPAN CITY, Oriental Mindoro – Malaki ang pasasalamat ng mga Mangyan na ngayon ay nagtatrabaho sa lugar na sakop ng Mindoro Nickel Project (MNP) ng Intex Resources Philippines, Inc. sa lalawigan ito dahil sa pagkakataong ibinigay sa kanila at sa suweldong tinatanggap nila na pantay sa mga natatanggap ng mga Tagalog o hindi Mangyan.

“Ngayon lamang kami nakaranas ng pantay na suweldo sa aming trabaho. Dati, mas malaki ang suweldo ng mga Tagalog kaysa amin. Pero ngayon, pareho ang pasweldo ng Intex sa Mangyan at sa Tagalog man. Kaya sana naman ay ipagpatuloy ng pamunuan ng Intex ang kanilang pagtulong sa amin hanggang magsimula na ang gagawing pagmimina.”

Ito ang tahasang sinabi ni Ramil Baldo, isa sa mga pinuno ng SADAKI (Samahan Apo Diya Alangan Kisluyan, Inc.), sa isang panayam kamakailan na isinagawa kamakailan sa kahilingan na rin ng nasabing opisyal kasama si Regin Garong, isa ring kinatawan ng nabanggit na lehitimong grupo ng tribong Alangan Mangyan na nakabase sa kabundukan ng Brgy. Villa Cerveza, sa bayan ng Victoria dito.

Kasabay nito, muling nilinaw nina Baldo at Garong na ang *exploration at proposed mining site* ng Intex Resources para sa MNP sa gitnang kabundukang lugar ng isla ng Mindoro partikular sa Kisluyan sa Brgy. Villa Cerveza ay bahagi ng lupang ninuno ng mga Alangan Mangyan, at doon na umano ipinanganak at lumaki ang dalawang nabanggit na pinuno ng mga katutubo.

“Kami at ang iba pa naming mga kasamahan at mga magulang namin, na mas matanda sa amin, ay makapagpapatunay na ang lugar na pagmiminahan ng Intex ay lupang ninuno naming mga Alangan,” dagdag na pahayag ni Garong, na siyang kasalukuyang kapitan at kini-kilalang “kuyay” (pinuno) ng Sitio Lipak Lakoy sa nasabi ring barangay.

Tiniyak pa ni Garong na tanging mga Alangan Mangyan na ngayon ay naninirahan doon ang siguradong maaapektuhan ng planong pagmimina ng Intex Resources. Noon umano, ang mga Mangyan ay itinuturing na “*second-class citizen*,” subalit sa tratong ibinigay sa kanila ngayon ng Intex gaya ng sa pagpapasahod ng mga Mangyang trabahador nito sa MNP, sinabi ni Baldo na parehas na ang antas ng pagtatrabaho nilang mga katutubo sa hindi katutubo ng Mindoro.

Ang ipinagtataka lamang umano ni Garong ay napakarami nang mga nagsasabi na sila ay tutulongan at pagmamalasakitan ngayong sila ay nagdesisyong para sa kanilang kabuhayan sa pamamagitan ng pakikipagkasundo nito sa kumpanyang Intex.

“Bakit noong kami ay naghihirap at wala halos makain, ang aming mga anak ay halos mamatay na sa gutom, ay walang gustong tumulong sa amin?”

Dahil dito, idiniin ng dalawang lider na hindang-hindi sila papayag na mayroong mga taong makikialam sa desisyong pagsang-ayon at pag-suporta nila (SADAKI) sa mga proyekto ng Intex Resources.

companies. The potential sites to be awarded include four in Ilocos Norte, one in Negros Occidental and one in Negros Oriental.

The DOE has pre-qualified Energy Development Corp. to assess and develop the Nagsurot site, and has likewise approved the firm's entry into the pre-qualification stage for the

Pagudpud site, both in Ilocos Norte.

Two more agudpud are up for award to Northern Luzon UPC Asia Corp. Although the company has already submitted all the requirements for its pre-commercial contract applications, the DOE still has to resolve the issue of overlapping areas, as part of its application covers an area that overlaps with the Pagudpud site that EDC is eyeing.

ongoing metallurgical pilot plant testing are available, detailed engineering and the design of the process plant will commence,” he said.

Intex plans to invest \$2.9 billion in a high-pressure acid leach (HPAL) facility at the Mindoro mine site which is actually located in Victoria town in Oriental Mindoro province and Sablayan in Occidental Mindoro.

government units banning large-scale mining in their areas.

“Aside from the environmental degradation, insignificant contribution to local and national economy, health hazards and massive displacement of people due militarization and confiscation of lands, are enough reasons for Governor Joel Reyes and his colleagues at the Provincial Board, to post the moratorium,” he said in an article on the Catholic Bishops Conference of the Philippines [website](#).

Included in the list of local governments that temporarily ordered halt to the large-scale mining activities are the provinces of Capiz, Western Samar, Northern Samar, Eastern Samar, Marinduque, Mindoro Oriental and North Cotabato, he said.

The Palawan government has good reason to post a moratorium in large scale mining, Bautista said.

For its part, the Philippine Misereor Partnership Mining Advocacy (PMP-MAC), in their national gathering held

The plant is projected to produce 80,000 metric tons of nickel and 3,700 metric tons of cobalt annually.

Grimstad said the new schedule should “allow lower [feasibility study] capital costs to be estimated, as it will better capture the general price deflation of capital items currently ongoing in the industry.”

“It will also enable a larger mineral reserve to be included in the [study's]

PMP is a network of church-based groups, non-governmental organizations, and people's organizations working for total human development.

Due to growing concern of ill effects of large-scale mining, PMP launched its mining advocacy campaign (MAC) in 2006 to strengthen the calls of the bishops, the *m i n i n g - a f f e c t e d* communities, and indigenous peoples, to confront the aggressive promotion of mining under the mining revitalization Program of the current administration.

parameters, as results from ongoing drilling at Buraboy [area in central Mindoro] can be included in the mining model,” he said.

The old schedule was to complete the study early next year, which would allow sourcing of funding by mid-2009 and start of construction by early 2010. Grimstad said funding could come from banks or from a possible partner.

The project — involving a

substantial nickel laterite deposits that the company says may be one of the biggest in the world — covers 9,720 hectares straddling the border of the provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Occidental Mindoro.

Most of the drilling work and evaluation were done initially in Kisluyan and Buraboy areas.

Manicani Island in Samar; Tandag in Surigao del Sur; Mati in Davao Oriental; and Tampakan in South Cotabato. In 2007, six new sites were added: Kabankalan and San Carlos, in Negros Occidental, Dinapigue in Isabela; Vitali in Zamboanga City and Tubay in Surigao del Sur.

“Under PGMA's administration, more mining tenements and applications have been approved at an unprecedented rate as compared to the number of Certificates of Ancestral Domain Titles (CADTs) issued. Large portions of these are within the ancestral domains of the indigenous people. This figure increases every day that's why it is not surprising the number of sites of struggle grows, too,” Acaba said.

In Advanced Exploration Stage are the following: Acoje PGE/Nickel Project; Colet Copper-Gold Project; Agata Project (Copper-Gold, Nickel); Balabag Project; Runruno Gold Project; and Pujada Nickel Project.

85 OFWs to return from Beirut

Noli orders investigation of alleged illegal recruitment & deployment

VICE PRESIDENT and presidential adviser on overseas Filipino workers (OFWs) Noli “Kabayan” De Castro announced last week that upon the arrival of 85 Filipinos from Beirut, the Task Force Against Illegal (TFAIR) recruitment will immediately investigate the case of their alleged illegal recruitment and

deployment. De Castro, who heads the TFAIR, received report from the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) and Philippine Embassy in Beirut that these OFWs were due to arrive January 9, at 10:40 pm via Etihad Airways, flight EY428. “I already instructed TFAIR to look into the case

of these 85 OFWs, as to who recruited them and as to how they were sent to Beirut, considering we have a ban on deployment to Lebanon,” De Castro said. Earlier, Philippine Ambassador to Beirut Gilberto Asuque sought the help of the Vice President as to the increase in numbers of OFWs being illegally deployed to Beirut. The Vice President immediately responded by tracking down recruiters who illegally deploy Filipinos to Beirut.

Moreover, upon hearing reports that there are a growing number of OFWs being housed in PE’s Filipino Workers Resource Center, De Castro asked Ambassador Asuque to act on the immediate repatriation of these stranded Filipino workers. “I want to reiterate that the ban on deployment to Lebanon still stands. So please do not fall for those who offer jobs in Lebanon. Do not be a victim of these unscrupulous individuals,” De Castro said.
